AACCC-UG ONLINE COUNSELING SCHEME FOR ADMISSION IN ALL INDIA QUOTA SEATS UNDER GOVT/GOVT.AIDED / CENTRAL UNIVERSITIES (CU)/NATIONAL INSTITUTES (NI) /DEEMED UNIVERSITY (DU) AND DELHI QUOTA (DQ) SEATS FOR THE ACADMEIC YEAR 2021-22.

DISCLAIMER

- a) All Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's) in the scheme of AACCC-UG Counseling are mandatory in nature and not optional. Candidates are advised to go through these important questions related to the scheme of counseling before registering on the AACCC website.
- b) It is assumed that every participating candidate in AACCC-UG Counseling has read, agreed and accepted the Scheme and the terms and conditions of the AACCC-UG counseling, 2021.
- c) The Candidate shall submit application for AACCC-UG Counseling, 2021 by online mode only through the AACCC website (www.aaccc.gov.in). Application submitted through any other mode shall be summarily rejected. Further, Candidates are advised to fill the application form on the AACCC website, on their own.
- d) The Candidate should ensure that all the information filled during the online submission of the application/registration form is correct and factual. Information provided by the candidates in the online application/registration form shall be treated as correct and self-certified. The AACCC shall not entertain, under any circumstances, any request for change/modify/edit/alter the information provided by the candidates.
- e) A candidate can submit application/registration form only once. Any candidate found to have submitted more than one application/registration form shall be debarred from AACCC-UG Counseling allotment process, his/her candidature shall be cancelled and further action as deemed appropriate by the AACCC, M/o Ayush shall be taken.
- f) Registration facility shall be available at the beginning of 1st Round, 2nd Round & 3rd Round /Mop-up Round of AACCC-UG Counseling, on dates as specified in Counseling Schedule. Thereafter, registration facility shall not be available, under any circumstances. Further, any request (for any reason), for registration, shall not be entertained after closing of registration. There will be no fresh registration for Stray Vacancy Round.

- g) The Security Deposit will be forfeited if a candidate who has been joined the allotted seat in the second Round & wants to exit from the respective institution. Further, the Security Deposit will be forfeited if a candidate has been allotted/upgraded a seat in the 3rd/Mop-up Round of AACCC-UG Counseling and does not join the respective institution or surrender the seat due to any unforeseen reason from the candidate's end. Also, the Security Deposit will be forfeited if the admission gets cancelled due to any reason from the candidate's end. E.g, in case the candidate gives wrong information at the time of registration on the basis of which a seat might be allotted and later on cancelled by the Admission Authorities at the time of reporting or fails to produce the required documents at the time of admission (within the stipulated time).
- h) If a candidate joins the allotted seat in the 2nd Round and thereafter wants to exit from the institute, he/she needs to relieve/resign from respective institute 3 days prior to the commencement of registration for 3rd/Mop-up Round of AACCC-UG counseling, with forfeiture of security money to avoid disqualifying from further counseling. In case, the candidate fails to do so, he/she shall be ineligible for further AYUSH counseling (Central/State/UT/Nominated).
- i) Once the candidate allotted a seat in the 3rd Round/ Mop-up Round or Final Stray Vacancy Round (conducted by the AACCC through online), he/she will not be eligible for exiting from the admitted/allotted seat and if so, he/she will not be eligible for further AYUSH Counseling and the security money of such candidates will be forfeited. Further, a list of such ineligible candidates will be circulated to concerned State/UT counseling authorities, National Institutes/ Central Universities/ Deemed Universities for prohibiting them to participate in any other AYUSH counseling.
- j) **Candidate may kindly note that merely registering for AACCC-UG Counseling, 2021 does not confer any automatic rights to secure an Under Graduate seat.** The selection and admission to Under Graduate seats in any ASU & H Institution recognized for running under graduate courses as per NCISM Act, 2020 & NCH Act, 2020 is subject to fulfilling the merit, admission criteria, eligibility, and such criteria as prescribed by the respective universities, ASU&H institutions, NCISM, NCH & State/Central Government.

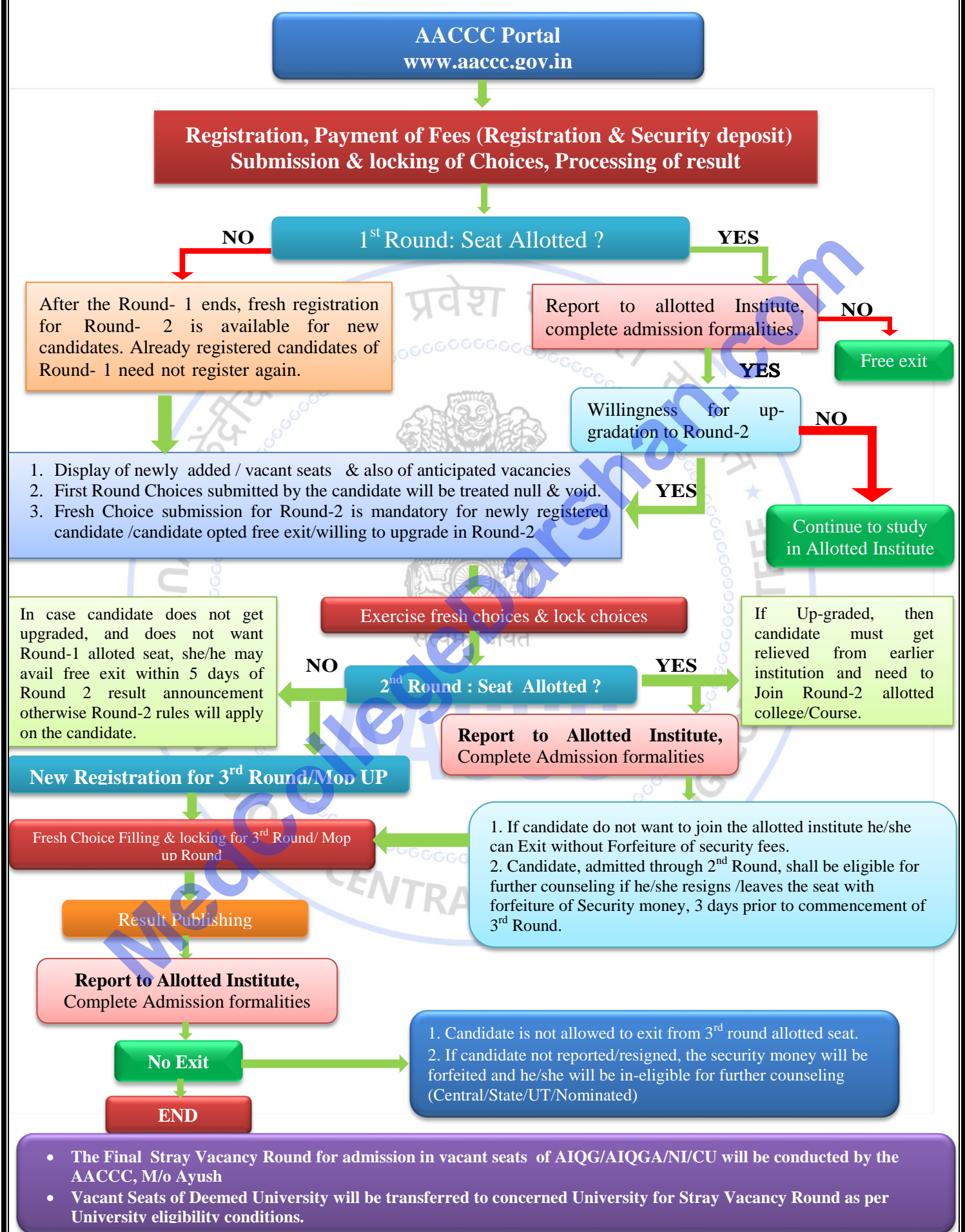
- k) The information regarding fee structure/bond amount/rendering of service in rural/tribal area/other conditions etc. has been provided by concerned Ayurveda / Homoeopathy/Unani/Siddha College. The AACCC shall not take responsibility regarding the above information including Fees/ Bond/ Mode of Payment or any typographical error/ data etc. Hence, Candidates are advised to visit the College website or contact the College Authorities directly for any query regarding the above information before filling choices. Choices once locked cannot be modified and any request regarding tinkering of choices will not be entertained.
- l) Candidates are advised to confirm the fee structure/ any other additional fee from the colleges especially Deemed Universities before filling up choices for the same. Some colleges/institute might have high fee structure; therefore confirmation about the fee should be made beforehand. The AACCC, M/o Ayush takes no responsibility for the fee structure of the colleges and will not entertain any request or complaint regarding Fee Structure.
- m) All India Quota UG (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS) seats of Private ASU & H Institutes (other than Deemed Universities) will be conducted by counseling authority of respective State/UT Government for the academic session 2021-22.
- n) For Admission in All India Quota UG (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS) seats of Private ASU & H Institutes/college (other than Deemed University), the candidates are required to contact the concerned State Government/Admission Authority.
- o) No communication will be directly sent to the Candidate(s). They are advised to be in touch with the AACCC website (www.aaccc.gov.in) on regular basis for any updates.
- p) For AACCC-UG counseling registration process, candidates are advised to use the same Mobile number/E-mail id used by them during registration for NEET-UG, 2021 examination on NTA website.
- q) AACCC will not entertain the admission made through offline mode by the college, in any circumstances. Therefore, candidates are advised to ask for online generated 'Provisional Admission Letter' at the time of physical reporting to ensure that the college has admitted him/her through online mode.
- r) There are some institutes reserved their all seats for minority category such as Jain Minority (JM), Muslim Minority (MM), Hindi Linguistic (HL), etc. In such institutes, only those students belong to respective category are eligible for admission.

s) Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's) are only for the guidance purpose. FAQ's are not valid for legal purpose. For any clarification in the FAQ's, candidates are advised to clarify it from AACCC through helpline **011-29870011**.

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CHAPTER-1 INTRODUCTION

Ayush Admissions Central Counseling Committee (AACCC) of Ministry of Ayush, Govt. of India, New Delhi is conducting Online Counseling for allotment of Under Graduate (BAMS/BUMS/BSMS/BHMS) seats under All India Quota in participating Govt./Govt. aided Ayurveda/Siddha/Unani/Homoeopathy Colleges (15%), Deemed Universities (100%), and Central Universities/National Institutes to the NEET qualified eligible candidates since 2019. The allotment of seats to the candidates is made based on the NEET UG, 2021 Examination conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA).

The AIQ seats* come under AACCC-UG Counselling:

- i. 15% All India Quota UG (BAMS/BUMS/BSMS/BHMS) Seats of Govt./Govt. aided institute of all States/UT's (except Jammu & Kashmir)
- ii. 100% BAMS Seats of BHU, Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh
- iii. 100% BAMS Seats of ITRA, Jamnagar, Gujarat(except nominated seats)
- iv. 100% BAMS seats of NIA, Jaipur, Rajasthan (except nominated seats)
- v. 100% BHMS seats of NIH, Kolkata, West Bengal (except nominated seats)
- vi. 100% UG (BAMS/BUMS/BSMS/BHMS) Seats of all Deemed Universities
- vii. 100 % (15% AIQ + 85% DQ) UG(BAMS/BUMS/BHMS) seats under Delhi University
- viii. 50% BUMS seats of AMU, Aligarh, Uttar Pradesh.
- ix. 50% BAMS & BHMS seats of NEIA&H, Shilong, Meghalaya

Further, the role of AACCC, M/o Ayush is limited to allotment of seats to the participating candidates, as per their merit and choice, which starts only after receiving the list/data/information of qualified candidates from the National Testing Agency.

(* The above percentage of All India quota seats is tentative)

CHAPTER-2 COUNSELING TYPES & ROUNDS

15% ALL INDIA QUOTA

- All candidates who have qualified NEET-UG, 2021 Examination are eligible. (except the Union Territory of J&K)
- The AACCC, M/o Ayush will conduct four rounds of counseling for admission in 15% All India Quota seats through online mode: i.e. Round 1, Round 2, Round 3/Mop-Up Round and Stray Vacancy Round.
- The Stray Vacancy round will be conducted for admission in vacant seats (non-reporting/non-joining) after 3rd /Mop Up Round.

CENTRAL UNIVERSITIES / NATIONAL INSTITUTES

- All candidates who have qualified NEET-UG, 2021 Examination are eligible. (except the Union Territory of J&K)
- The AACCC, M/o Ayush will conduct four rounds of counseling for admission in Central Universities and National Institutes through online mode: i.e. Round 1, Round 2, Round 3/Mop-Up Round and Stray Vacancy Round.
- The Stray Vacancy Round will be conducted for admission in vacant seats (non-reporting/non-joining) after 3rd /Mop Up Round.

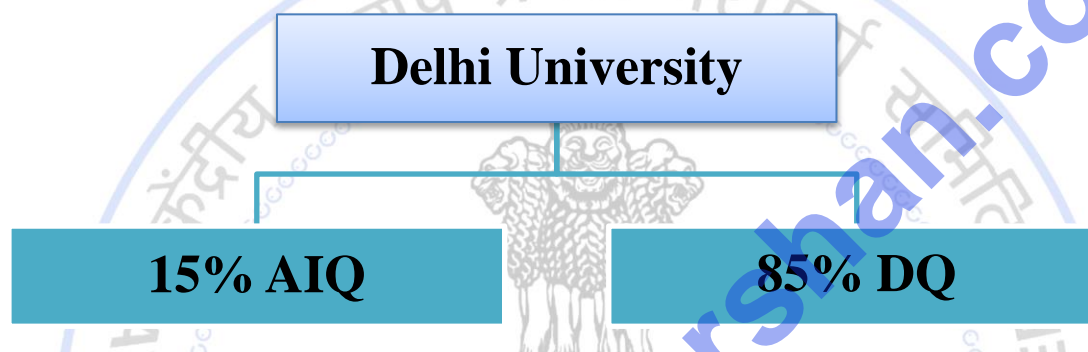
100% DEEMED UNIVERSITY

- All eligible candidates who have qualified NEET-UG 2021, including candidates from the Union Territory of J&K are eligible.
- There will be four rounds of counseling i.e. Round 1, Round 2, Round 3/ Mop-Up Round and Stray Vacancy Round.
- Out of the four rounds, three rounds will be conducted online by the AACCC i.e. Round 1, Round 2, and Round 3/Mop-Up Round.
- The Stray Vacancy round shall be conducted by the respective Deemed Universities, for which the list of registered eligible Candidates will be forwarded by the AACCC to the respective Deemed Universities.
- All UG seats of Deemed Universities are un-reserved i.e reservation policy of Central Govt. is not applicable.

CHAPTER-3 Delhi University

ASU & H UG Colleges under Delhi University

1. Ayurvedic & Unani Tibbia College, Karol Bagh, New Delhi (BAMS/BUMS)
2. Nehru Homoeopathic Medical College, Defense Colony, New Delhi (BHMS)



15% Seats will be contributed by the Delhi University to All India Quota. Remaining 85% DQ seats are reserved for candidates who have studied 11th & 12th grade in Delhi NCT.

Reservation Policy:

The reservation policy of the Central Government is followed:

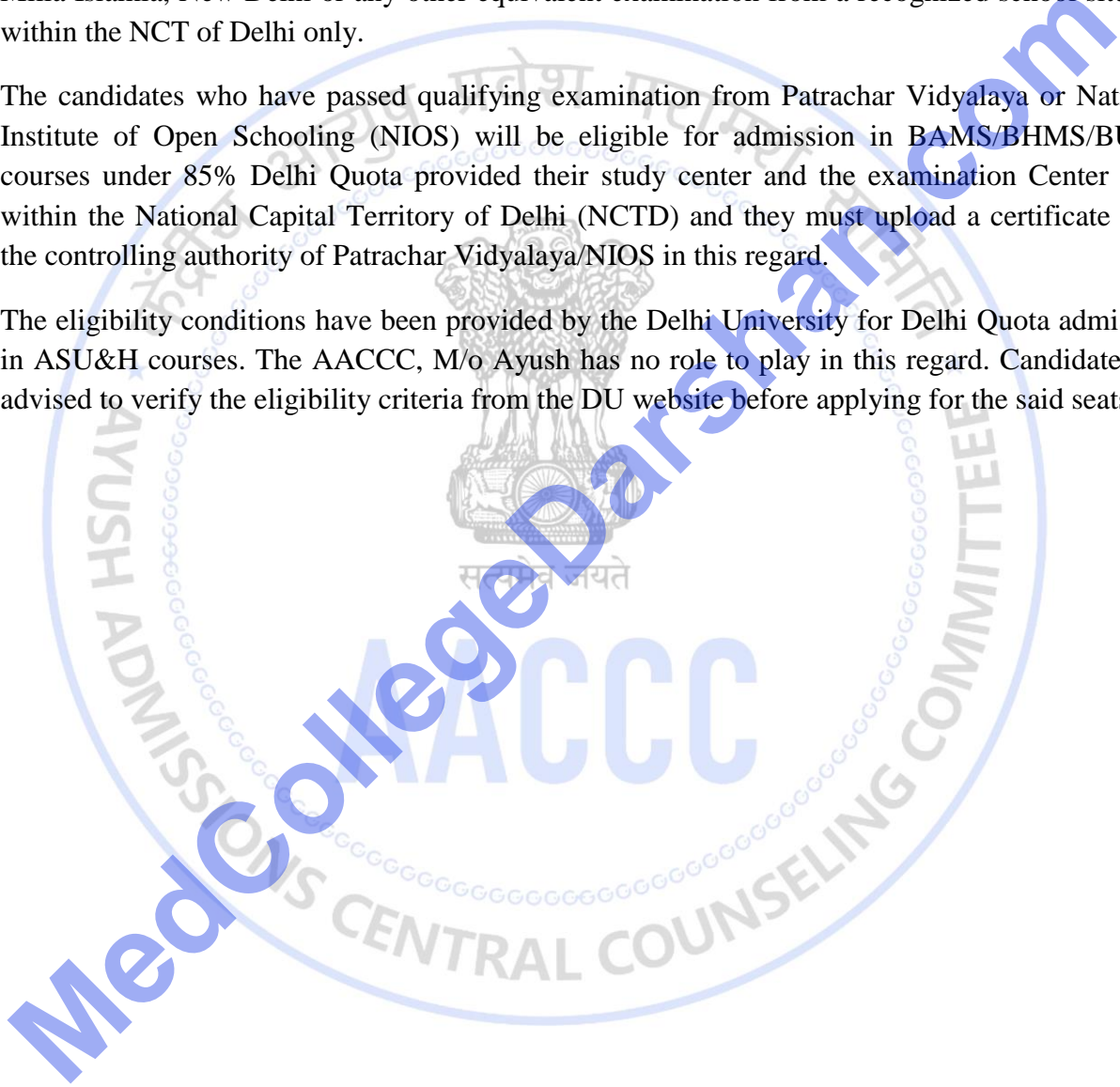
- S.C.-15%
- S.T.-7.5%
- O.B.C.-27% (Non-Creamy Layer) as per central list
- EWS-10%
- Reservation for Children/ Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (C.W): Concerned candidates are advised to check their eligibility and the rules thereof with the Delhi University before applying for the said reservation. (The Candidates who have filled in their category as CW, their names will be verified by the Competent Authority.)

Roster:

- The roster on the 15% AIQ seats shall be applied by the AACCC, Ministry of Ayush.
- The roster on the 85 % DQ seats shall be applied by the Delhi University, for which the AACCC shall not be held liable, if any discrepancy arises.

Eligibility Condition for Delhi Quota (85%):

1. The candidates should have completed the age of 17 years on or before 31st December, 2021. The candidates completing the age of 17 years on 01st January, 2022 or later will not be eligible for admission, i.e. the candidate must be born on or before 31.12.2004.
2. To become eligible for 85% Delhi Quota, the candidate must have passed 11th and 12th Standard examination under 10+2 system conducted by CBSE/Indian School/certificate examination/Jamia Milia Islamia, New Delhi or any other equivalent examination from a recognized school situated within the NCT of Delhi only.
3. The candidates who have passed qualifying examination from Patrachar Vidyalaya or National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) will be eligible for admission in BAMS/BHMS/BUMS courses under 85% Delhi Quota provided their study center and the examination Center were within the National Capital Territory of Delhi (NCTD) and they must upload a certificate from the controlling authority of Patrachar Vidyalaya/NIOS in this regard.
4. The eligibility conditions have been provided by the Delhi University for Delhi Quota admission in ASU&H courses. The AACCC, M/o Ayush has no role to play in this regard. Candidates are advised to verify the eligibility criteria from the DU website before applying for the said seats.



CHAPTER-3 RESERVATION POLICY

The reservation policy of the Central Government is applicable in 15 % AIQ seats of Govt./Govt Aided ASU & H Colleges /Central Universities/ National Institutes as under:

- S.C.- 15%
- S.T.- 7.5%
- O.B.C.- 27% (Non-Creamy Layer as per central list)
- EWS- 10% (as per Central Govt. norms)
- PwD- 5% Horizontal Reservation

Reservation of seats under PwD Category has been increased from 3% to 5% in AIQ and the 21 Benchmark Disabilities as envisaged under the regulations of Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016. Candidates who want to avail 5% PwD reservation in UG seats Govt./Govt. Aided/Central/National ASU & H institutions, should obtain a Disability certificate as per 21 Benchmark Disabilities given under RPWD Act 2016, from the designated disability Centers as per the list enclosed as **ANNEXURE-II. The certificate issued by any other hospital/ board will not be accepted.** Further, the format of 'Certificate of Disability' is attached in Annexure-I.

The certificates should be issued by the competent authority and as per the prescribed format of the Government of India. In case the candidate fails to produce Caste and PwD/EWS certificate in the prescribed format, if applicable, at allotted ASU & H College then he/she will not be permitted to take admission and his/her category will be changed in next round, if otherwise eligible. Further, Candidates are requested to read NEET-UG, 2021 Bulletin/Prospectus in detail, regarding Caste, EWS and PwD Reservation/Certificate carefully.

The seats remain vacant due to non-joining/non-reporting/vacating of 2nd Round will be converted during 3rd /Mop-up of counseling as per the following algorithm, only if the reserved seat is not opted by any candidate/non-availability of candidate of that particular category:-

CHAPTER-4 REGISTRATION & COUNSELING PROCESS

IMPORTANT

- ❖ NEET (UG), 2021 qualified candidates are required to register on the AACCC website (www.aaccc.gov.in) to participate in the AACCC-UG counseling.
- ❖ Candidates are advised to use the same E-mail address and Mobile Number for registration on the AACCC portal for Counseling which was provided during NEET-UG, 2021 Registration.
- ❖ All the information/ communication will be sent by AACCC, Ministry of Ayush on the registered E-mail address or registered Mobile Number only.
- ❖ Any request regarding change of registered mobile number or email address shall not be entertained by the AACCC, Ministry of Ayush.
- ❖ Candidates are advised to use a Laptop or Computer with uninterrupted network during the Registration and Choice-Filling process to avoid any technical complications.

ROUND-1

Eligibility: Only NEET-UG 2021 qualified candidates will be eligible to apply for the AACCC-UG counseling.

Process:

Step 1: Registration for AACCC-UG Counseling.

Step 2: Payment of Counselling Fee (Non Refundable Registration Fee + Security Deposit Money)

Step 3: Choice filling and locking

Step 4: Release of Seat allotment list (Result Publication)

Step 5: Physical Reporting to the allotted college.

ROUND-2

Eligibility:

- a) NEET (UG)-2021 qualified candidates who have not registered in Round-1.
- b) A candidate who registered for Round-1 and was not allotted any seat.
- c) Candidates who have opted for free exit in the 1st Round.
- d) Candidates who joined the allotted seat in the 1st Round and submitted willingness for up-gradation in the 2nd Round.

Process:

Step 1: Registration for AACCC- UG Counseling. (The candidates participated in 1st Round need not to be registered again)

Step 2: Payment of Counseling Fee includes Non-Refundable Registration Fee + Security Money (Need not pay by the candidates, those who already paid the counseling fee at time of registration for 1st Round)

Step 3: Choice filling and locking.

Step 4: Release of Seat allotment list (Result Publication)

Step 5: Physical Reporting to the allotted college.

ROUND-3/MOP-UP ROUND

Eligibility

- a) NEET (UG)-2021 qualified candidates who have not registered in Round-1 & Round 2.
- b) Those who registered but were not allotted a seat in Round-1 & Round-2.
- c) The candidate registered in Round-1/Round 2 & availed Free Exit.
- d) Candidates who joined the allotted seat in the 2nd Round and submitted willingness for up-gradation in the 3rd Round
- e) Those Candidates who leave/resign the allotted seat in the 2nd Round, with forfeiture of Security money, 3 days prior to the commencement of the 3rd Round can register again with payment of complete fees.

Process

Step 1: Registration for AACCC-UG Counseling. (Those candidates who participated in 1st Round/2nd Round need not be registered afresh)

Step 2: Payment of Counseling Fee includes non-refundable Registration Fee and Security Money. (Need not pay by the candidates, those who already paid the counseling fee at time of registration for 1st Round /2nd Round)

Step 3: Choice filling and locking.

Step 4: Release of Seat allotment list (Result Publication)

Step 5: Physical Reporting to the allotted college.

IMPORTANT

It is mandatory for the candidates to take admission on their upgraded seats in the 3rd Round/ Mop-Up Round from Round 1 & 2 admitted seats. Such candidates, if not joined in the upgraded seats, are ineligible for any further AYUSH counseling (Central/State/UT/ Nominated seat, etc.) and their security money will be forfeited.

FINAL STRAY VACANCY ROUND FOR AIQG/AIQGA/CU/NI

- The Stray Vacancy Round for admission in vacant seats (not joined/non-reporting) after 3rd/Mop-up Round of AACCC-UG Counseling of Govt./Govt. Aided colleges/CU/NI will be conducted through online mode by the AACCC, M/o Ayush.

Eligibility & Process

- a) All registered candidates who were not allotted a seat in any of the previous rounds are eligible for Stray Vacancy Round.
- b) There will be no Fresh Registration in Final Stray Vacancy Round.
- c) There will be no choice filling in Final Stray Vacancy Round.
- d) The choices filled during 3rd/Mop-Up Round will be considered for allotment in Stray Vacancy Round.
- e) The seats will be allotted by the software as per choices submitted during 3rd/Mop-up Round.

FINAL STRAY VACANCY ROUND FOR DEEMED UNIVERSITY

- For Deemed Universities, the Stray Vacancy Round will be conducted by the respective Deemed University.
- AACCC will send a list of eligible registered candidates to Deemed Universities and is to be exhausted strictly in order of merit in Stray vacancy Round.

IMPORTANT

Further, a list of ineligible candidates will also be circulated to concerned State/UT counseling authorities, National Institutes/ Central Universities/ Deemed Universities for prohibiting them to participate in any other AYUSH counseling (Central/State/UT/ Nominated seat, etc.).

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's)

Q.No.1. When will be the online allotment process for this Academic Year started?

Ans: The Online allotment process will start as per the Schedule of AACCC-UG Counseling for the Academic Year 2021-22. Please See the Schedule available on the www.aaccc.gov.in website.

Q.No.2. How to get registered on the AACCC website/Portal and how to fill Choices?

Ans: Candidates will have to log on to the website (www.aaccc.gov.in) to get registered and then fill-in choices. Please read and understand counseling scheme/FAQ's carefully, prior to online registration & choice filling. Further candidates may advise to make a tentative list as per their own preference of colleges/Courses after going through the seat matrix before choice filling/locking.

Please, also note that the registration facility will be available at the beginning of the 1st Round, 2nd Round, and 3rd/Mop-up Round. There will be no fresh registration for Stray Vacancy Round.

Q. No. 3. How and when do I have to make the payment?

Ans: After registration, the payment page appears automatically. Candidates can do online payment by Net Banking /credit card/ debit card only. After the successful completion of payment, the candidate can proceed with choice filling.

Q.No.4. Do I have to report to any counseling center for registration or choice filling?

Ans: No, Online registration and choice filling can be done from the place of convenience (including from home) using a laptop/computer with an uninterrupted internet facility.

Q.No.5. Do I require any documents to get registered online?

Ans: Since it is an online allotment (Counseling) process, no documents are required. However, you need to fill up the same information that you have given at the time of registration for the NEET (UG), 2021 examination and upload the copy of Cancelled Cheque/Bank Passbook/ Bank e-Statement (having account details).

IMPORTANT

Please note that, on the AACCC portal, you have to fill in exactly the same spelling, numbers, etc as you have already filled in your application form for NEET (UG)-2021 Examination.

Q.No.6. How do I get the password for logging in?

Ans: During the process of online registration, you will have to create your own password. Candidates are advised to keep the password confidential till the end of the counseling process. Candidate can change the password in the future as per convenience. Sharing of password can result in its misuse by somebody else, leading to even exclusion of genuine candidates from the online allotment process. *(Please see password policy uploaded in the AACCC portal)*

Q. No. 7. Difficulty in login, what may be the problem(s)?

Ans: Follow the instructions about the use of browser (Mozilla Firefox, Internet Explorer – (Latest Version), Google Chrome), use of same spellings, same format of date (use digits for day, month, and year with ‘-’ in between) as in application form submitted at the time of registration of NEET(UG)-2021 Examination. The internet connection should be uninterrupted. If internet connection interruption takes place, the IP address which is being monitored will change and session expired message will be displayed.

Q No. 8. I have difficulty in creating a Password, what may be the problem(s)?

Ans: Create a password as per password policy. Please use the internet browser as suggested above (Q.No.7), as it is difficult to log in from some of the other browsers. While creating password use the ‘Shift’ key instead of the ‘Caps Lock’ key.

Q. No. 9. If I forget the password that I have created earlier, how to retrieve it?

Ans: To retrieve the forgotten password, the system facilitates the following process:

Reset password using reset link via registered email

Candidate has to enter their NEET-UG, 2021 Roll No. If entered data (Roll No.) matches with backend database then system will send a reset password link to the registered email-id. After clicking the received link in their mail-inbox, candidates are required follow the online instruction for resetting the New Password.

OR**Reset password using a OTP via SMS**

Candidate has to enter their NEET-UG, 2021 Roll No. If entered data (Roll No.) matches with backend database then system will send verification code to the registered mobile no. Candidates are required to enter verification code, if verification code matches with database then system will prompt for resetting New Password.

Q. No. 10: When I try to log in for choice filling/ submission, it says wrong roll number/ password, what may be the problem(s)?

Ans: This can happen if the roll number or password typed is incorrect. Password is case sensitive; therefore, use exactly the same password created earlier. In case password is forgotten, try to retrieve it by using the security question and its answer.

Q. No.11: Is there any restriction for filling up the number of choices of Institutions and courses?

Ans: No, during online choice filling, you can give as many choices as you wish. However, choices of colleges/courses should be in the order of candidates' preference (higher to lower). There will be common software for AIQ/ Deemed/ National Institutes/Central Universities/Delhi Quota for filling up choices.

Q. No. 12: Can I have some idea about the seat I am likely to get at my rank?

Ans: You can have some idea from the following:

Please log on to the website (www.aacc.gov.in)– from the home page-click on **UG Counseling tab** and from **Archives** under **News & Events** section, you will get details of Course and category wise Opening and Closing rank of admission in ASU&H UG courses in the previous year i.e, A.Y-2020-21 (Excluding data of candidates admitted in Stray vacancy round). This will only be an indicative and the admission pattern for the current A.Y may vary as per the availability of UG seats in ASU&H courses.

Q. No.13: Is it necessary to fill up the choices and lock the choices to get seat allotted? Or I will be allotted seat automatically from leftover seats?

Ans: After online registration, you have to fill in the choices of colleges/courses in order of your preference and lock it before server time. Once the choice is filled in, it can be modified before locking. If a candidate does not lock the choice submitted by him/her, it will be automatically locked as per schedule/ Server time. If you don't fill in choices even after registered in the AACCC portal, you will not be allotted any seat. Candidates can download/print out the locked choices for future reference.

Q.No.14. Can I modify my choices during the choice submission period for counseling?

Ans: Yes, you can modify, add or delete your choices during the choice Filling/Locking period. Further, you are requested to do the same before locking the choices by yourself or by the System as per schedule/ Server time.

Q.No.15. If I have not locked my choices before the time specified in counseling schedule on last date of choice locking, what will happen to my choices?

Ans: The choices submitted and saved by you will be locked automatically on the last date of choice locking as per server time.

Q.No.16. How can I get print out of my choices?

Ans: Candidates are requested to login at AACCC portal and take printout of their choices which was locked by them during the choice filling /Locking period or after the specified time of the last date of choice locking.

Q. No. 17. If I locked my choices, later I want to modify/edit my choices, is it possible?

Ans: Once candidates lock the choices, it is not possible to unlock the same even from the AACCC end. Hence, the candidate is advised to check all choices before locking.

IMPORTANT

Don't wait till the last minute to Register and fill in choices. Please go through your selected/submitted choices before locking, as once you lock the choices it cannot be modified or changed even if you have made a mistake. It may result in the allotment of a seat which you never wanted. (Please note that the choices once locked cannot be unlocked even from the AACCC end)

Q.No.18. What about the condition of fee structure/bond amount/rendering of service in rural/tribal area/other conditions.

Ans: Fee structure/bond amount/rendering of service in rural/tribal area/other conditions, etc. may vary from State to State and Institute to Institute. The allotment made through the online Counseling process will be firm and final. Therefore, the candidates should well aware of these points before opting a seat at ASU & H Colleges. The AACCC shall neither be responsible nor entertain any case on the above grounds, if any.

The information received from various participating ASU&H UG Colleges has been made available on the Counseling website. However, before filling the choices, candidates are advised to visit the College website or contact the College Authorities directly for any query regarding the above information. Choices once locked cannot be modified and any request to the AACCC regarding tinkering of choices will not be entertained.

IMPORTANT

AACCC has no role in the fixation of Fee Structure/ Stipend of ASU & H Colleges. Therefore, the AACCC will not entertain any request or complaint regarding Fee Structure/ Stipend.

Q.No.19. How much time will be given to join the allotted course?

Ans: Candidates who are allotted seats will be required to join the allotted College/Course within stipulated time from the date of allotment as mentioned in the counseling schedule. However, candidates are advised to join as early as possible and not to wait till the last day of joining, due to the different schedules of holiday/working hours in various ASU & H Colleges. In some of the Colleges it takes 4 to 5 days for completion of admission formalities.

Q.No.20. Whether my admission is valid if college admitted me on the allotted seat through offline mode?

Ans: No, AACCC will not entertain the admission made through offline mode by the college, in any circumstances. Therefore, candidates are advised to ask for online generated 'Provisional Admission Letter' through AACCC portal, at the time of admission to ensure that the college has admitted him/her through online mode.

Q. No. 21. What documents are required at the time of Joining/ Reporting in allotted ASU& H College?

Ans: Original documents (along with attested photocopies of documents) required at the time of joining in allotted ASU& H College are as below:

- i. Admit Cards of NEET Exam issued by NTA.
- ii. NEET Result/ Rank letter issued by NTA.
- iii. Date of Birth Certificate (if 10th Standard Certificate does not bear the same)
- iv. Class 10th Certificate
- v. Class 10+2 Certificate
- vi. Class 10+2 Marks Sheet
- vii. Eight (8) Passport size photograph same as affixed on the application form.
- viii. Provisional Allotment Letter generated online from AACCC portal.
- ix. Proof of identity (Aadhar/ PAN/ Driving License/ Passport/ Voter ID)
- x. Medical Fitness Certificate issued by Registered Medical Practitioner in prescribed format as attached in **Annexure-VI**.
- xi. The Candidate should also bring the following certificate, if applicable:
 - a) Disability Certificate issued from a duly constituted and authorized Medical Board for 21 Benchmark Disabilities as per the Rights of Persons with

Disability Act, 2016. **No other PwD certificate, issued by any other Authorities/ Hospital will be entertained.** The format of **Certificate of Disability** is attached as **ANNEXURE-I**.

(The qualified Persons with Disability (PwD) candidates should get themselves certified at one of the under mentioned Disability Assessment Boards, constituted in various States/Uts. The list of Centers who will issue Disability Certificates as per 21 Benchmark Disabilities given under RPWD Act-2016 is attached as **ANNEXURE-II**.)

- b) SC/ST Certificate, issued by the **competent authority**, should be in English or Hindi language. Sub caste should be clearly mentioned in the certificate. Certificate should be **as per the prescribed format of Government of India (ANNEXURE-III)**.
- c) OBC certificate issued by the Competent Authority. The sub-caste should tally with the Central List of OBC. The OBC candidates should not belong to Creamy Layer. The OBC certificate must be as per the prescribed format of Government of India (**Annexure-IV**).
- d) Economically Weaker Section (EWS) certificate issued by the Competent Authority. (**Annexure-V**)
- e) Certificate of 10th standard having **Tamil** as one of the subjects in case of admission in BSMS course or candidate has to study Tamil as subject during the 1st professional course.
- f) Certificate of 10th standard having Urdu or Arabic or Persian language as one of the subject in case of admission in BUMS course or candidate has to pass the test of Urdu of 10th standard (wherever there is provision to conduct of such test) in the entrance examination conducted by the University or Board or registered Society or Association authorized by the Government to conduct such examination.

IMPORTANT

Candidates without original certificates/documents shall not be allowed to take admission to the allotted ASU&H College. Candidates who have deposited their original documents with any other Institute/ College/University and come for admission with a certificate stating that "their original certificates are deposited with the Institute/College/University" shall not be allowed to take admission in allotted ASU & H College.

Q.No.22. What are the instructions regarding EWS, OBC, SC, ST & PwD certificates as well as Reservation?

Ans: The certificate should be issued in the prescribed format by the competent authority. In case the candidate fails to produce Caste and PwD/EWS certificate in the prescribed format, if applicable, at allotted ASU & H College then he/she will not be permitted to take admission and his/her category will be changed in the next round, if otherwise eligible. Further candidates are advised to read the **Information Bulletin of NEET-UG, 2021** carefully, which is available at following link: <https://neet.nta.nic.in/webinfo/File/ViewFile?FileId=83&LangId=P>

Q.No.23. In case, I have Birth Certificate/Caste Certificate/other certificate(s) in regional language, will it be acceptable at the time of reporting/joining?

Ans: Certificates issued by the Competent Authority should be in English or Hindi language. Candidates are advised to carry a Certified Copy of the English version of the original certificate, in case the certificate issued is in other than English language, along with original certificate as most of the states insist for certificates issued in the English language.

Q.No.24. If there is a discrepancy in spelling in documents and the application form, what can I do?

Ans: If there is discrepancy in spelling in documents, the candidate must carry an affidavit/undertaking to prove that the documents belong to the same person.

Q.No.25. At the time of admission, will my original certificates be retained by the allotted college/institution?

Ans: Yes, all the participating colleges/institutions have been instructed to retain original certificates of admitted students and release them only on up-gradation of the seat or resignation/cancellation by the candidate.

Q.No.26. Is it necessary to join the allotted ASU&H College to get a chance to participate in the 2nd Round?

Ans: If the candidate not interested in 1st Round allotted seat, he/she can avail free exit without reporting/joining the allotted college. However, if he/she wants to hold the allotted seat in the 1st Round, he/she need to join the college physically and submit up-gradation willingness for 2nd Round at the time of admission.

IMPORTANT

Please note that, in case, you have joined the course/college allotted in the 1st Round and not submitted the option for up-gradation in the 2nd Round, you will not be considered eligible for up-gradation in the 2nd Round.

Q.No.27. What is the time period for free exit for admitted candidates of the 1st Round?

Ans: A candidate joined in the 1st Round allotted seat but has not been Upgraded in Round-2 may resign his allotted seat in 1st Round within five days of Round-2 Result announcement, failing which he/she will be considered as joined candidates for Round-2 and rules of Round-2 will apply accordingly.

Q. No 28. What is the procedure for 2nd Round?

Ans: There will be fresh registration in the 2nd Round for candidates who have not registered in the 1st Round of Counseling. Further those candidates who have availed free exit in 1st Round or those candidates who have joined in 1st Round allotted seat and submitted willingness for up-gradation may submit fresh choices during 2nd Round choice fill in period, if they want up-gradation. Eligible candidates will be allotted seats on the basis of his/her choice and merit.

The candidates will be shown all choices including newly added seats (seats available against vacant seats and seats likely to be available- virtual vacancies which are likely to get vacated during up- gradation).

All eligible candidates, who desire to take part in the 2nd Round of online allotment, will have to submit fresh choices during choice submission period and lock the choices during the period of locking. Eligible candidates will be allotted seats on the basis of his/her choice and merit.

The choices of candidates who have joined in 1st Round allotted seat and submitted willingness for up-gradation, would be initialized (the choices remaining after allotment, submitted before round-1 will stand cancelled), and candidates are required to submit fresh choices for up-gradation to 2nd Round. Choices which were filled during 1st Round will be null & void.

Q.No.29. Who is eligible for the 2nd Round of allotment?

Ans: Candidates eligible for seat allotment in the 2nd Round would be from one of the following groups:

Group-I: Newly registered candidate for Round-2

Group-II: Registered candidates who did not get any seat in the 1st Round.

Group-III: Candidates who have reported at the allotted institute during 1st Round and submitted willingness for 2nd Round up-gradation as 'Yes'.

Group-IV: Candidates who have been allotted a seat in 1st Round but not Joined/ not Reported. (i.e, availed 'free exit')

Group VI: Candidates who have resigned from the allotted seat of 1st Round before the commencement of 2nd Round.

Q.No.30. Do I have to fill-up choices of course and College to participate in the 2nd Round of the online allotment process?

Ans: Yes, eligible candidates must have to submit fresh choice(s) for consideration for seat allotment during the 2nd Round. If candidate does not submit fresh choice(s) during choice filling period, the candidate will not be considered for allotment of seat during the 2nd Round and will retain the already allotted (joined) seat in the 1st Round, if any.

It is necessary to fill in fresh choices in each Round if candidate want to upgrade his/her admitted seats

Q.No.31. If I give consent for the 2nd Round up-gradation at the time of joining to 1st Round allotted seat and further my choice is upgraded in 2nd Round, is it necessary to join allotted college?

Ans: Yes, In case candidate is allotted seat during the 2nd Round of allotment process, the seat allotted during the 1st Round will be automatically cancelled immediately (i.e, allotted to somebody else) and candidate should have to join the college/seat allotted during 2nd Round after obtaining online generated relieving letter from the college allotted in the 1st Round.

If a candidate does not join the college/seat allotted during the 2nd Round, he /she can avail of free exit. If the candidate joins the allotted/up-graded seat in the 2nd Round, he/she can exit with forfeiture of security money within the stipulated period (i.e, 3 days prior to commencement of 3rd Round/Mop-up Round). If the candidate fails to do so, he/she will ineligible for further counseling. (Central/State/UT/Nominated.)

Seats can also be upgraded in the same college (same course) by change of category (i.e.ST/SC/OBC to UR or PwD to non-PwD), in such a case also the candidate has to take fresh admission on the upgraded seat, as per the procedure.

Q.No.32. If I opted for up-gradation during joining of 1st Round allotted seat, but later change my decision and want to retain allotted seat, how to avoid change/cancellation of already allotted college/seat?

Ans: The candidate need not fill any fresh choices for the 2nd Round, so the earlier allotted seat will be retained.

Q.No.33. If I opted for up-gradation in the 2nd Round/3rd Round of counseling at the time of reporting to 1st Round/2nd Round allotted college, whether my allotted seat (of first/second round) will be cancelled?

Ans: Yes, if the seat is upgraded in the 2nd Round/ 3rd Round or Mop-up round, the earlier allotted seat will automatically be cancelled and the same will be allotted to another candidate.

Q.No.34. If I get an upgraded seat during the 2nd Round/3rd Round of AACCC-UG counseling from 1st Round/2nd Round, can I join that college directly?

Ans: No, you will have to get a relieving letter from the earlier institute/college (of 1st/2nd Round), generated through AACCC portal, before you join the upgraded college/institution.

Q.No.35. In case, I get an upgraded seat but in the same college, because of a change of category, (e.g. from SC/ST/OBC to UR category) do I have to take admission on the upgraded/allotted seat again?

Ans: Yes, you have to get an online generated relieving letter through AACCC portal, from the institute for the earlier allotted seat and then get a Provisional Admission Letter, generated online, for the upgraded category seat; otherwise, your earlier seat would be cancelled.

Q.No.36. Is it necessary to join the 2nd Round allotted ASU&H College to get chance to participate in 3rd Round?

Ans: No, candidates need not report/join the 2nd Round allotted college, since there is free exit. However, if he/she wants to hold the 2nd Round allotted seat, he/she need to join the college physically and give up-gradation willingness for the 3rd Round/ Mop-Up Round at the time of admission of 2nd Round allotted college. Further, if a candidate wants to exit/resign from joined institute/course, he/she will be allowed to exit 3 days prior to the commencement of the 3rd Round with forfeiture of security money. If a candidate fails to do so, he/she shall be ineligible for further counseling (Central/State/UT's)

IMPORTANT

Please note that, in case, candidate have not submitted willingness for up-gradation in the 3rd Round at the time of joining/reporting of 2st Round allotted College, he/she will not be considered eligible for up-gradation in 3rd Round.

Q.No.37. If I joined the allotted seat in the 2nd Round, but later change my decision and want to exit, then am I eligible for further counseling (Central/State/UT)?

Ans: Candidate needs to relieve/resign from respective institute 3 days prior to commencement of 3rd Round/Mop-up Round with forfeiture of security money. In case, candidate fails to do so, he/she shall ineligible for further AYUSH counseling (Central/State/UT).

Q.No.38. Am I eligible for further counseling, if I resigned from joined institute/course allotted in the 2nd Round?

Ans. Yes, the candidate shall be eligible for further counseling if he/she resign/leave from the institute/ course allotted in 2nd Round 3 days prior to the commencement of Registration for the 3rd Round/Mop-up Round with forfeiture of security money.

Q.No.39. Who will be eligible for “Exit with Forfeiture” option in 2nd Round?

Ans: If a Candidate joined in 2nd Round allotted seat and wants to exit within the stipulated period, he/she may resign/leave with Forfeiture of Security Money.

Further, candidate will be ineligible for any other counseling (Central/State/UT) if he/she resign/leave beyond the permissible period (i.e, 3 days prior to the commencement of 3rd Round).

Q.No.40. I have registered in 1st Round, should I register again for 2nd Round & 3rd Round/Mop-Up Round?

Ans: No, only those candidates who have not registered in the 1st Round need to register afresh for the 2nd Round/3rd Round.

Q.No.41. Who will be eligible for the 3rd Round/Mop-Up Round of AACCC-UG Counseling?

Ans: The Following categories of candidates are eligible for 3rd Round/Mop-Up Round:

- a) Candidates who are registering for the first time.
- b) Candidates who have registered but not been allotted a seat in Round-1 & Round 2.
- c) All candidates admitted in Round 1 or Round 2 and opted for up-gradation of their admitted seats (with fresh choice filling).
- d) Candidates admitted in Round 1 and avail free exit option within stipulated period.
- e) Candidate allotted seat in 2nd Round and avail free exit (not joined/ not reported).
- f) Candidate resigned from the 2nd Round allotted seat, 3 days prior to commencement of the 3rd Round, with forfeiture of Security Money (Need to register fresh registration with payments of complete fees).

Q.No.42. What is the procedure for the 3rd Round/Mop Up Round Counseling?

Ans: There will be fresh registration in the 3rd Round for candidates who have not registered in the 1st Round/2nd Round of Counselling. Further, those candidates opted up-gradation at the time of reporting to the 1st/2nd Round allotted institute/course may submit fresh Choices during 3rd Round choice filling period, if they want up-gradation. The eligible candidates will be allotted seats on basis of his/her choice and merit.

The seat matrix for vacant seats due to non-joining/non-reporting/vacating of the 2nd Round will be published on the AACCC portal and eligible candidates have to submit fresh choices. The candidates will be shown all choices (seats available against vacancy and likely to be available i.e., virtual vacancies which are likely to get vacated during up-gradation and also during the conversion of seats as per the following algorithm).

The seats remain vacant after 2nd Round will be converted during 3rd /Mop-up of counseling as per the following algorithm, only if the reserved seat is not opted by any candidate/non-availability of candidate of that particular category:-

*Applicable only, in case of all India quota seats of Govt., Govt. Aided, Central Universities & National Institutes.

Note: Candidates cannot claim Virtual vacancy seats. The Seat will be converted as per aforesaid algorithm, only if the reserved seat is not opted by any candidate/non-availability of candidate of that particular category. UR category candidates cannot claim the reserved seats shown to them as a virtual vacancy, if the same seat is opted by the candidate of that particular category.

Q.No.43. What will happen to seats, which remain vacant after completion of the 3rd Round/Mop-up Round?

Ans: All India Quota seats of Govt. and Govt. aided/CU/NI institutions remain vacant after the last date for joining will be allotted during the final Stray Vacancy Round conducted by the AACCC, M/o Ayush.

The Vacant seats of Deemed University after 3rd/Mop-Up Round will revert back to respective Deemed University for conducting final Stray Vacancy Round.

Further, the list of ineligible candidates will also be circulated to concerned State/UT counseling authorities, National Institutes/ Central Universities/ Deemed Universities for prohibiting them in participating for further counseling. (Please see the schedule on the website.)

Q.No.44. Whether Up-gradation is allowed from the 2nd Round counseling to the 3rd Round/Mop Up Round AACCC-UG counseling ?

Ans: Yes, Up-gradation is allowed from the 2nd Round counseling to the 3rd/Mop-up round. However, it is mandatory for the candidates to take admission on their upgraded seats in the 3rd Round/ Mop Up round from 1st & 2nd Round admitted seats. **Such candidates, if not joined the upgraded seats, then their security money will be forfeited and will become ineligible for any further counseling. (Central/State/UT/Nominated seat).**

Q.No.45. Whether I am eligible for State/UT Counseling if allotted a seat in the 3rd Round of AACCC-UG counseling?

Ans: No, if a candidate has been allotted a seat in the 3rd Round/ Mop-up Round, he/she will not be eligible for any further Counseling. Further, it is mandatory for the candidates to take admission on their upgraded seats in the 3rd/ Mop Up round from Round 1 & 2 admitted seats. Such candidates, if not join the upgraded seats, then they are ineligible for any further counseling (State/UT/ Nominated seat, etc.) and their security money will be forfeited. The names of all ineligible candidates will be circulated to all Central/State counseling authorities for prohibiting them to participate in any other counseling.

Q. No. 46. Whether any registration/choice filling in the final Stray vacancy round of AACCC-UG counseling?

Ans. No, there is no fresh registration or choice filling is available in the final Stray vacancy round of AACCC-UG counseling. Further, the Choices exercised by candidates in 3rd/Mop Up Round will be considered for allotment of seats for Stray Vacancy Round.

Q. No. 47: Who is Eligible for Stray Vacancy Round?

Ans: All registered candidates who were not allotted any seat in any of the previous rounds are eligible for stray vacancy round. However, Candidates are advised to check their eligibility conditions before applying.

Q.No.48. Who is ineligible for the final Stray Vacancy Round of the AACCC-UG Counseling?

Ans:

1. Candidates who already joined the allotted seat in Round 1/Round 2/ Round 3 or Mop-Up Round of AIQ/ Deemed/ Central Universities/National Institutions.
2. Candidates allotted a seat in 3rd/Mop Up Round.
3. Candidates who have not registered in any of the Previous 3 Rounds.
4. Candidates who are resigned from the allotted seats in the 2nd Round beyond the permissible period of exit (i.e., 3 days prior to the commencement of the 3rd Round).

Q.No.49. Whether the Security Fees will be refunded back, if a candidate is not allotted seat in all three (1st/2nd/3rd or mop-up/Stray vacancy) Rounds of AACCC-UG counseling?

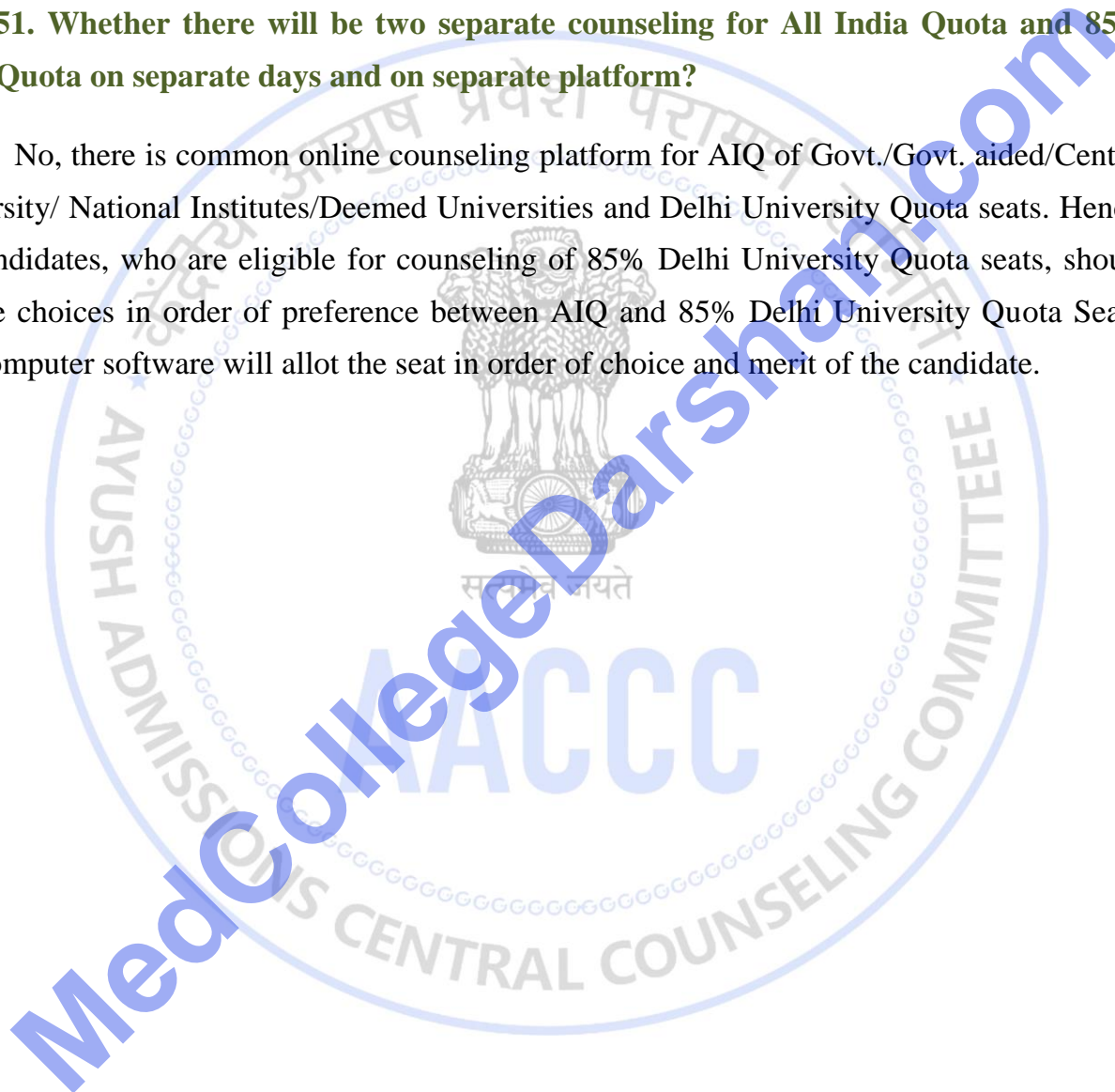
Ans: Yes, in case the candidate is not allotted any seat during AACCC-UG counseling, the Security Fees will be refunded back to the bank account provided by the candidate at the time of registration.

Q.No.50. Who is eligible for the “Exit with Forfeiture” option in the 3rd / Mop-Up Round?

Ans: Candidate who has been allotted a seat in 03rd / Mop up Round but does not report at the college may Exit with Forfeiture. (i.e. The refundable security amount will not be refunded). Further, he/she will be ineligible for any other counseling. (State/UTs)

Q.No.51. Whether there will be two separate counseling for All India Quota and 85% Delhi Quota on separate days and on separate platform?

Ans: No, there is common online counseling platform for AIQ of Govt./Govt. aided/Central University/ National Institutes/Deemed Universities and Delhi University Quota seats. Hence, the candidates, who are eligible for counseling of 85% Delhi University Quota seats, should opt the choices in order of preference between AIQ and 85% Delhi University Quota Seats. The computer software will allot the seat in order of choice and merit of the candidate.



Q.No.52. What is the permissibility to students to exercise fresh choice during counseling?

Ans: The following Matrix explains the above question:

CHAPTER-6 REGISTRATION FEE & SECURITY MONEY

FEES RELATED FAQ's

Q. No. 1: What are the various fees to be paid at the time of registration?

Ans: At the time of registration, students must pay two kinds of fee

a) Non-Refundable Registration Fee

- Rs. 1000/- for AIQG/AIQGA/Central University/National Institute UR/EWS/OBC candidates.
- Rs. 500/- For SC/ ST/ PWD
- Rs. 5000/- For Deemed University for all Categories.

b) Refundable Security Fee will be refunded to candidates after joining the allotted college or if candidate did not get any seat during counseling, to the same account of candidate from which payment had been made.

- For AIQG/AIQGA/National Institute/Central University UR/EWS/OBC candidates– Rs.10,000/-
- For SC/ST/ PWD –Rs. 10,000/-
- For Deemed University-Rs. 50,000/-For example:
 1. Any candidate opting for Deemed University will have to pay an amount of Rs.55000/- at the time of registration (i.e., Rs 5000/- Non-Refundable Registration fee + Rs. 50,000/- Refundable Security fee.)
 2. Any OBC candidate opting for AIQG only will have to pay an amount of Rs.11000/- at the time of registration (i.e., Rs 1000/- Non-Refundable Registration fee + Rs. 10,000/- refundable Security fee.)

Q. No. 2: If candidate wish to apply for both AIQ and Deemed University, he/she need to pay fee for both?

Ans: No, in such case the candidate has to pay only the higher fee i.e. of Deemed University Rs. 5000/- (Registration fee) plus Rs. 50,000/- (security money).

REFUND RELATED FAQ's

Q.No.1. When will the Refundable security amount be refunded, if I am eligible as per Refund Policy?

Ans. Refund will be initiated only after completion of all rounds of AACCC–UG Counseling.

Q.No.2. When and where the Security amount will be refunded?

Ans:

- Security amount will be refunded only after 20 working days from the date of publication of refund list by AACCC on its website (www.aacc.gov.in)
- The security amount will be refunded to the Bank Account, provided by the candidate at the time of online registration on AACCC portal i.e. www.aacc.gov.in
- The candidates are advised to keep their bank account active till the refund process completed.

Q.No.3. What happens if the candidate, by mistake, makes more than one payment for the same Roll #?

Ans: Candidate can approach the Financial Custodian after 15 days of closing of Registration Window. The Financial custodian will refund the excess payment, if any, within 30 days of receipt request from the candidate.

Q.No.4. Do I have to request the Financial Custodian to refund the security amount? What is the schedule for refund of security amount?

Ans:

- NO. Candidate need not approach the Financial Custodian for refund of security amount.
- The AACCC will publish the list of candidates who are eligible for the refund of security amount in the AACCC website (www.aacc.gov.in) as and when the counseling is completed (Once all rounds of counseling are completed). The Financial Custodian will complete the refund of security amount within 20 working days of publishing the eligible list in the AACCC Website.
- Once the Financial Custodian completes the refund, AACCC will publish the refund details along with refund date & transaction # in the website of AACCC (www.aacc.gov.in). The refund will be credited, depending upon the level of digitalization of candidate's bank, to the candidates account between 02 to 15 days from the date of refund by Financial Custodian.

Q.No.5. Can I initiate refund proceedings through chargeback claim through the card issuing bank?

Ans: No, Candidates who have been allotted Roll # should not initiate refund proceedings through chargeback claim through the card issuing bank. If the charge back claim is initiated, the Financial Custodian will not be in a position to initiate direct refund and thereby refund of security amount will be delayed.

Q.No.6. Who is the Financial Custodian?

Ans: All India Institute of Ayurveda (AIIA), New Delhi, an autonomous institute under the Ministry of Ayush is the Financial Custodian. They will, on behalf of AACCC, collect non-refundable Registration Fees and refundable security amount from the candidates and refund the security amount, on the advice of AACCC, to the candidates.

Q.No.7. How to contact the Financial Custodian?

Ans: The candidate can contact Financial Custodian (finance-aacc@aiia.gov.in) through registered mail id.

- Direct queries to AACCC regarding payment /refund will not be entertained.
- Financial custodian will entertain only payment and refund related queries through finance-aacc@aiia.gov.in
- For other than financial related queries, the candidates may contact AACCC through mail counseling-aacc@aiia.gov.in

Q.No.8. Will AACCC bears the bank charges incurred by the candidate while registering for counseling?

Ans: No, Bank Charges, if any, incurred by the candidate should be borne by themselves.

Q.No.9. Will the AACCC pays interest in the refundable security amount?

Ans: No, AACCC will not pay interest on the refundable security amount.

Q.No.10. Can candidate remit the Registration Fee and Security Deposit from NRI Account?

Ans: No, since AACCC cannot, as per Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Rules, refund security deposit to NRI Account. If the candidate wants to use the funds available in his/ her NRI Account for registering for counseling, he/ she has to first transfer funds from NRI Account to NRO Account and from NRO Account to AACCC. There fund from AACCC will be credited to NRO Account only.

Q.No.11. If the candidate does not get payment confirmation from payment gateway provider, whom he/she should approach for payment confirmation?

Ans: The candidate should approach the Financial Custodian, who will respond within 5 bank working days of closing of Registration window.

Q.No.12. Is this Security fee refundable in all the cases?

Ans: No, in the following cases Security Money shall be forfeited:

- If the candidate who has been leave/resigned from the joined institute/course allotted during 2nd Round.
- If the candidate who has been allotted a seat in the 3rd Round/Mop-up Round/Final Stray Vacancy Round and does not join in the respective institution.
- If candidate not joined in upgraded seats in 2nd and 3rd/ Mop-up round from Round-1 and Round-2 admitted seats respectively.
- If the candidate gives wrong information at the time of registration on the basis of which a seat may be allotted and later cancelled by the Admission Authorities at the time of reporting.
